**Knowing How to Know** - Idries Shah 2020-06-06

Contemporary esoteric systems almost always play on the desire of mankind to seek or acquire knowledge. All but universally neglected in such systems are the aa often unrecognized aa barriers which prevent knowledge and understanding. Before learning can take place, certain conditions and basic factors must be in place; in the individual or the group. Building on the foundations laid in *Learning How to Learn* and *The Commanding Self*, Idries Shah in *Knowing How to Know* illuminates those factors. A World Torn Apart - Victoria Carpenter 2007

This collection of essays derives from a conference on Violence, Culture and Identity held in St Andrews in June 2003. It is a contribution to the understanding of representations of violence in Latin American narrative. The collected essays are dedicated to the study of the problematic history of violence as a means of 'civilizing' the region: violence used by dictatorial regimes to eradicate the collective memory of their actions; violence as a result of the history of marginalizing segments of the population; sexual violence as an attempt at complete control of the victim. The essays establish a clear link between historical, political and literary constructs spanning the past five hundred years of Latin American history. Close readings of political texts, historical documents, prose, poetry and films employ identity theories, postcolonial discourse, and the principles of mimetic and sacrificial violence. The volume adds to the ongoing critical investigation of the relationship between Latin American history and narrative, and to the key role of representations of violence within that narrative tradition.

90 Miles to Paradise - Jaime Sabina Perez 2021-04-17

The year is 1994. After a routine night of fishing, 16-year-old Jaime and his friend Josue encounter three hardened criminals on a Cuban beach. Their goal: Find a raft - anything seaworthy - and get to the United States. They're offering money, a lot of it, for the one the boys have. For many teenagers, it would have been a lucky, one-time windfall. But when Jaime watches the three men take to the open sea, it kindles a dream. He wants what these men are seeking: Freedom. But for Jaime, the son of hardworking, stalwart Communists, the path to the United States will be anything but smooth. Soon afterward, Fidel Castro "opens the coast," granting amnesty to anyone who wants to leave. Jaime and his friends are already building a new boat that they believe will withstand the ocean and get them to the United States. But fate has a twisted path ahead: Like many fleeing Cubans, Jaime and his friends will be rescued from the open waters by the U.S. Coast Guard and taken to the Guantanamo Bay Naval Base, an American-run refugee camp that will swell to a population of more than 35,000. The future is uncertain; news is scarce. Is anyone really destined to get to the US? Or does their future lie on the other side of the concertina wire, back in Communist-run Cuba? As a teenager alone in the camps, Jaime tests the boundaries and bends the rules. He survives a daring-but-failed escape attempt, a riot, a hurricane, and even Guantanamo Bay's soon-to-be-infamous "Camp X-

Ray." Along the way, he is helped by a series of unlikely friends, from a voodoo priest to an Army chaplain. Now a successful businessman in North Carolina, Jaime Perez had a ringside seat to one of the most remarkable periods in Cuban-US history. In simple, quick-moving prose, he takes the reader back to the sights, sounds and experiences of Cuba in 1994, and makes us understand the forces that make people go to such great lengths to be free. *90 Miles to Paradise* is an unforgettable story of courage and faith.

Desde el umbral se mira el horizonte; y desde México puede atisbarse a lo lejos el acontecer de otras sociedades. De esa premisa, que acepta que

el mundo es ancho pero no ajeno, parte Carlos Martínez Assad para examinar los encuentros y desencuentros entre Oriente y Occidente. A partir de la crítica a la visión orientalista, que se inventó un mundo árabe más cercano de la idealización romántica que de la realidad histórica, Cruzar el umbral al Medio Oriente ofrece una mirada a una pequeña región cuyas dimensiones no corresponden con lo grande de sus

aportaciones. En sus páginas se ofrece un recorrido marcado por el testimonio de los grandes viajeros, por la simbiosis entre la lengua árabe y la religión islámica, y particularmente por las representaciones de los escritores de estos países, con sus formas de concebir propuestas culturales y sus posturas respecto a la compleja situación política de hoy.
