chapter 26 reflective practice and critical

underlying it reflective practice emerges principally from the work of donald schon for example 1983 and 1987 who was one of the first to alert us to the crisis in the professions often represented by the perceived gap between formal theory and actual practice in schon s thinking reflective practice was a way of reducing the gap

the teaching philosophy reflective practice teaching guides

the statement of teaching philosophy often shortened to teaching philosophy is a written reflection that uses specific examples to articulate and demonstrate your beliefs about teaching and learning your statement details the ways your day to day practices reflect and inform your approach to teaching
